A state grant administered through the Air District replaced four old, polluting school buses in Kings Canyon Unified School District last month with new buses that run 85 percent cleaner than their predecessors.

The new buses are part of the Lower Emission School Bus Program, which allocates \$39 million to the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District through the state Air Resources Board.

This project is an example of how the Air District targets the areas of greatest need in the Valley for critical funding," said Seyed Sadredin, the Air District's executive director and air pollution control officer.

The four new buses replaced buses manufactured before 1977, which produce about seven tons of emissions over their lifetime, compared to lifetime emissions of one ton for buses manufactured today. Additionally, older buses are not subject to federal safety standards. All pre-1977 buses in the Valley will be replaced with Prop 1B funding. Remaining funds will be used for retrofits and additional replacements.
