Mr. Moore presented the Staff Report

GUARDIAN has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, 4101, and California Health and Safety Code (CH&SC) § 41701, in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance will be for a non-consecutive 92.04 hour period to occur sometime between September 15, 2021, and December 13, 2021, inclusive. If granted, the variance will allow the continued operation of the glass melting furnace, and continued glass production with excess visible emissions, while GUARDIAN shuts down the emission control system in order to perform routine maintenance on the EP.

<u>Petitioner Comments</u>: Mr. Roach mentioned that this is the final entry into the EP where a third party contactor will be blasting out the fields and make necessary repairs.

Hearing Board Comments: Mr. Mulligan asked if the facility felt comfortable with the 92 hours to complete the repairs. Mr. Roach responded that the facility expects to the activity to last between 70 and 80 hours. Mr. Robertson asked if this was the first time the facility was cleaning the EP this year. Mr. Roach responded that the facility typically has a quarterly cycle to do an external blowdown of the EP fields to keep the field strength going until they can do the entry at the end of the year. Mr. Robertson asked if there was flexibility with the third party contractor schedule to do the variance on a low particulate matter day. Mr. Roach responded that the schedule is fixed.
