The requested variance period would be for a non-consecutive 72-hour period to occur sometime between July 22, 2019, and October 19, 2019, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow Chevron to continue to store VOC containing liquids in the subject tanks without an operating or functional VRS while Chevron conducts the proposed work. In addition, it will allow wells with closed casing gas vents to produce into tanks that do not have a functional or operating VRS.
