The presentation focuses on the findings of a study conducted in 2007 and 2008 that examined the impact of elevated ozone and PM2.5 on a cohort of asthmatic subjects. The study measured this possible health impact in several ways: Samples of urine were collected from subjects at regular intervals during the 2007-2008 winter season and the 2008 summer season. These samples were analyzed for the presence of quinones, chemicals that are by-products of fuel and wood combustion and are known to create pulmonary stress. During the same clinic visit, pulmonary function tests were conducted on subjects to evaluate the presence of suppressed lung function. Finally, hourly measurements of ambient ozone and PM2.5 were correlated with both the concentration of quinones in the urine and lung function measures.
