These exceptional conditions, including record lows for precipitation, extreme temperatures, and strong stability/inversions have resulted in detrimental impacts on air quality throughout the San Joaquin Valley and the rest of the state. These extreme conditions overwhelmed strong air pollution control measures that are already in place in the Valley and throughout California and led to large increases in ambient pollution concentrations despite significant reductions in emission rates. In addition to the immediate air quality impacts resulting from these conditions, the lack of precipitation sets the stage for a dangerous wildfire season in the coming year.
