Tip: The District's <u>Clean Green Yard Machines</u> program offers up to a \$250 rebate for a new electric mower when an old gas mower is retired. \$50 rebates are also now available for eligible electric yard equipment (mowers, edgers, string trimmers, and more), without retiring old equipment.
