- 4. PUBLIC COMMENT None
- 5. REPORT ON DISTRICT CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES Dennis Tristao, Kings County City Representative on the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) gave the presentation on this item which provided highlights from the May 7, 2013 CAC meeting. He reported CAC members received an update on the development of Rule 9610 (State Implementation Plan Credit for Emission Reductions Generated through Incentive Programs). In addition, he stated that Dr. Lighthall, the District's Health Science Advisor provided CAC with a presentation regarding Valley Fever. He also reported that CAC members approved EJAG Grant Recommendations for grant funding in Valley environmental justice areas. Lastly, he reported EJAG unanimously elected Bob, Smith, a Bakersfield City Councilmember, as its new Vice-Chair.

6. AUTHORIZE THE APCO, WITH BOARD CHAIR SIGNATURE, TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH A SELECTED CONTRACTOR FOR THE OZONE SATURATION STUDY IN THE ARVIN AREA – Mr. Sadredin gave the presentation on this item, which proposed to authorize the Executive/Director/APCO to negotiate and enter into an agreement, with Board Chair signature, between the District and the selected contractor to conduct an ozone saturation study in the Arvin area. He noted this study is necessary due to the relocation of the ARB air quality monitoring station in Arvin. He stated EPA has indicated that because of the difference in readings between the old and new sites, it may impact their ability to find the Valley in attainment of federal ozone standards.

He stated success of this project depends on the selected contractor being able to purchase equipment, select sites, install equipment, and begin operation of the temporary ozone monitoring network before this summer's peak ozone season for the Arvin area (August-September). He noted the recommendations in today's item are needed to ensure that the project begins in a timely manner and achieves the desired objectives.

Councilmember Hanson commented on information indicating the Arvin/DiGeorgio monitoring site registered ozone levels 10% lower than the Arvin/Bear Mountain site. He asked about the statement that indicated that EPA may not be able to find the Valley in attainment of ozone standards due to the difference in readings. Mr. Sadredin stated one reason the reading is lower at the new site is that air quality has improved and noted that the District is hoping to use the results of this study to help demonstrate attainment with EPA standards.

Supervisor Case commented this study would be an important tool, given the questions regarding air quality monitoring in Arvin. Dr. Sherriffs asked about the timeline for the ozone study. Mr. Sadredin responded there is some preparatory work to do before actual monitoring can occur between the months of July and September.



Motion unanimously carried to authorize the APCO, with Board Chair signature, to execute an Agreement with a selected contractor for the Ozone Saturation Study in the Arvin area.

7. APPOINT AD HOC SUBCOMMITTEE TO OVERSEE AND GUIDE AN EVALUATION OF ORGANIZATIONAL AND WORKLOAD ISSUES – Mr. Sadredin explained that the Board had extensive discussion on this item at the recent Study Session. He stated this topic is important, not because there is any crisis at the District, but in response to the District's core value of continuous improvement. He noted this Subcommittee will address such issues as succession planning as there are several retirements and separations coming up. He stated at the Study Session, the Board agreed to appoint an Ad Hoc Subcommittee to oversee and guide an evaluation of organizational and workload issues, and asked for volunteers from the Board to serve on this committee. The following Board members were appointed to serve on the Subcommittee: Supervisor O'Brien – Chair, Supervisor Worthley – Vice Chair, Supervisor Walsh, Supervisor Case, Supervisor Couch, Supervisor Barba, and Councilmember Bomprezzi.

- 8. VERBAL REPORT ON AIR RESOURCES BOARD ACTIVITIES Dr. Sherriffs gave a report on highlights from ARB Board meetings held on April 19 and April 25, 2013. He stated on April 19th, the Board approved linking the state Cap and Trade Program with Quebec. In addition, he reported on April 25th, the Board held a public hearing to present its draft three-year Investment Plan for Cap and Trade auction proceeds. In addition, he reported ARB staff and representatives of large California air districts, including the Valley Air District, provided an update on efforts to develop a new State plan for responding to refinery emergencies.

- 10. GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS Supervisor Worthley thanked staff for their work on the 2013 Governing Board Study Session. Councilmember Hanson thanked Mr. Sadredin and staff at the Bakersfield office, particularly Jennifer Turnipseed, for arranging a Southern Region facility tour for him. He stated it provided him with great insight into District operations. Councilmember Barwick also thanked staff for a great Study Session.
