 PUBLIC COMMENT – Fred Fuchs, Central California Association of Public Employees/SEIU 700, expressed his optimism regarding the District and staff salary/benefit negotiations currently taking place. Mr. Fuchs commended the District's negotiators Carolyn Rose, Director of Personnel, Tom Riggs, and District staff.

Gary Rohman, ECCO Equipment, lauded the District's Governing Board and staff for a job well done in administering the District's voluntary incentive grant programs.

Jerry Frost, Kern Oil & Refinery, noted that a EPA news release announced that starting June 1, 2006 EPA will require refiners and fuel importers to cut the sulfur content of highway diesel fuel 97 percent, from 500 parts per million (ppm) to 15 ppm. Mr. Frost indicated that Kern Oil & Refinery as of June 1, 2006 is producing ultra-low sulfur diesel.

5. REPORT FROM CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CAC) — Report given by Dennis Tristao, City Primary Member, Kings County, and Chair of the CAC. Mr. Tristao noted that during the CAC meeting held on June 6, 2006 the CAC offered comments on their support or opposition to the Governing Board adopting Rule 4570 (Confined Animal Facilities). Mr. Tristao reported that a motion was made to support the Governing Board's adoption of Rule 4570 and the outcome of the roll call vote was six ayes, seven abstentions and one no vote, therefore the CAC did not reach a consensus. Mr. Tristao indicated the Environmental Interest Group voted in support of Rule 4570 with a caveat that the District should work on future enhancements.

Mr. Tristao reported the CAC meeting was webcast for the first time, and he congratulated District staff for their efforts.

Tom Frantz, Association of Irritated Residents, suggested the District require facilities that utilize emergency flares to pay a fine based on the going rate for natural gas when they burn their flares for a certain number of days in a row.

Sarah Sharpe, Coalition for Clean Air and Sarah Jackson, Earthjustice, suggested that the District amend the rule to include a requirement for a flare mitigation plan.

Carolina Simunovic, Fresno Metro Ministry and Rey Leon, Latino Issues Forum, suggested that the rule be amended, and made more stringent in the future.
