- 8. <u>REPORT ON DISTRICT CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES</u> this item was tabled to a later time.
- 9. ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE \$20,768,770 IN ADDITIONAL REVENUE FROM THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY TO FUND THE REPLACEMENT OF AGRICULTURAL TRACTORS, HEAVY-DUTY TRUCKS AND WOOD BURNING DEVICES Aaron Tarango, Program Manager in the District's Grants and Incentives Department, presented this item which asked the Board to accept and appropriate \$20,768,770 from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for the following projects:
  - \$8,000,000 to replace agricultural tractors that have uncontrolled, Tier 1 or Tier 2 engines with new agricultural tractors that have Tier 4 engines;
  - \$8,000,000 to change out open-hearth fireplaces or non-certified wood burning devices with new electric heat pumps, gas devices, or certified wood-burning devices;
  - \$4,768,770 to replace heavy-duty diesel trucks with zero and near-zero emissions heavy-duty trucks.

Supervisor Wheeler said it was great to see so much funding awarded to the

District. He asked if pellet burning devices were better now than 10 years ago. Mr. Sheikh responded they continue to get better over time and said funding for these devices is available in areas that do not have access to natural gas.

Supervisor Mendes congratulated staff for receiving this funding and said this just proves that District staff are the best in the nation.

Vice Mayor Fugazi returned at 9:55 a.m.

Councilmember Bessinger also congratulated staff on receiving this level of funding for the Valley and said it is indicative of commitment on the federal level to the problem which was nice. He suggested targeting outreach for gas fireplaces towards senior citizens who are more likely than not to be living in older homes with wood burning fireplaces. He added they would greatly benefit from this program. Mr. Sheikh thanked Councilmember Bessinger for his great suggestion and said he would follow up with him to help develop more targeted outreach.

Dr. Sherriffs said there is a great need in the Valley and said this large award definitely speaks to the quality of work that staff have been doing on these programs. He said there are local health effects as well as regional effects and every step does make a difference for residents in the Valley.

8. <u>REPORT ON DISTRICT CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES</u> – Kevin Abernathy, Citizens Advisory Committee Chair, presented the report to the Board.

On behalf of the Board, Chairman Pedersen presented a plaque recognizing Mr. Abernathy's service on the Citizens Advisory Committee as Chair for the past two years. Manuel Cunha, incoming Citizens Advisory Committee Chair also thanked Mr. Abernathy for his service. 10. <u>ADOPT PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE 4905 (NATURAL GAS-FIRED, FAN-TYPE CENTRAL FURNACES)</u> – Jon Klassen, Director of the District's Air Quality Science and Planning Department, presented this item asking the Board to adopt proposed amendments to Rule 4905 (*Natural Gas-Fired, Fan-Type Central Furnaces*).

Dr. Sherriffs said once again the flexibility of the District has to be commended in terms of how we approach these things, continue to get input and not be afraid of readjusting courses. He said it was important to continue to look for the cleanest available technologies.

Dr. Pacheco-Werner asked when Board members should expect an assessment of whether the 2023 timeline will be sufficient. She echoed Dr. Sherriffs' comments about continuing to look for the cleanest available technologies. Mr. Sheikh responded that while the technology is advancing, the pandemic has caused many uncertainties. As the new compliance date approaches, if there are major concerns form the manufacturers in developing the technology staff will likely hear during that year. Mr. Sheikh said staff would continue working with District partners at South Coast and Bay Area AQMD and other jurisdictions such as land-use agencies that are looking at new building standards as well.

Dr. Sherriffs asked what the rest of the municipal solid waste facilities were doing with their waste. Mr. Sheikh responded that another primary method for non-hazardous waste was landfilling the material so they are subject to the general waste requirements.
