NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN THAT, according to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) policy, high pollution concentrations are not considered in an area's attainment designation when there is a clear, causal relationship between the exceptional or natural event and the high particulate concentrations. The District has prepared documentation regarding the causes and contributing factors of the particulate episodes, and plans to submit the documents to the California Air Resources Board and the US EPA by April 10, 2008.
