Notice is hereby given that the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (District) proposes to issue a Proposed Negative Declaration for the following project:

PROJECT TITLE, LOCATION, AND DESCRIPTION

Project Title: Proposed Re-Adoption of Rule 4570 (Confined Animal Facilities)

Project Location: This rule applies to any confined animal facility located within the boundaries of the San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District.

Description of Project: The San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District Governing Board will hear the Public Health Impact report for this rule on June 18, 2009 and will then consider either readopting the rule, as written, or directing the staff to amend the rule. This analysis assumes the Board will readopt the rule, as written, with no significant changes.

AVAILABILITY OF INITIAL STUDY AND PROPOSED NEGATIVE DECLARATION: The Proposed Negative Declaration is based upon a finding that the project will not have significant impacts on the environment or human health. The reasons to support such a finding are documented in the Initial Study and Proposed Negative Declaration prepared by the District.
