HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE ADVISORY GROUP (EJAG) MEETING OF JANUARY 29, 2015

Update on AB 32 Cap and Trade funding for Valley EJ communities – Tom Jordan, provided an update on funding being allocated by the state under AB32. EJAG continued to recommend that District staff work to support bringing these funds into the Valley to fund EJ projects.

EJAG 2015 Goals and Objectives Action Plan – The EJAG reviewed the 2014 Goals and Objectives and voiced support to continue the ongoing work to meet these goals in the coming year. The EJAG unanimously approved the 2015 Goals and Objectives (attached).

EJAG Bylaws - As previously established by the EJAG, there was an annual review of the EJAG bylaws to ensure understanding of the purpose, responsibilities and duties of the EJAG as well as the rules and authority under which it functions.

Transboundary Ozone Conference – The EJAG discussed having the District financially support three EJAG members to attend the Transboundary Ozone conference to be held March 31 through April 2, 2015. Marvin Dean was assigned one of the three slots by the EJAG Chair. The other two slots were randomly awarded to interested EJAG members.
