

Issues to Consider

- All appointments must be made by the Valley-wide Special City Selection Committee
 - -CANNOT delegate to another entity
 - –Each appointment requires a majority vote
 - -May adopt nomination procedures





Issues to Consider (cont'd.)

- Cannot change the terms for the current city members on the Air Board
 - Small city representation from the Northern Region stays with Councilmember Vierra until 2013
 - May assign to a small city in Kern County the remainder of the former Councilmember Brar's term or start anew





Issues to Consider (cont'd.)

- What to do with mid-term changes
 - Resignations
 - Electoral changes

Tasks Ahead

- Fill 4 city vacancies on the Air Board
 - Appoint 2 "Large" city members
 - Must be from 2 different regions
 - "Small" city selection impacts county eligibility
 - Appoint 2 "Small" city members
 - 1 from either Madera, Fresno, or Kings County
 - 1 from either Kern, or Tulare County
 - "Large" city selection impacts county eligibility
- Adopt nomination and selection procedures including application process, and timelines





Suggested Rotation Schedule and Procedures

- Guiding Principles
 - Fair rotation allowing broad participation by all regions and cities over time
 - -Satisfy all legal requirements
 - -Fair and orderly
 - Opportunity for local input
 - -Open to the public at every step
- Start with "large" cities with no prior membership on the Air Board

Nomination Process

- Establish a new rotation schedule every 8 years
- Use State Department of Finance Population Estimates to define small and large cities
- Appointments will have a fixed term of 3 year from January 1st to December 31st
- All cities in the county scheduled for an appointment will get to vote for the nominees from the cities within the county
- Cities will vote for candidates at the regularly scheduled public meeting
- Each city will select a nominee receiving a majority vote from the council
- The candidate receiving a vote from the majority of the cities will be presented as the nominee to the Valley-wide Special City Selection Committee for appointment
- Ties will be broken by random drawing





Application Process

- The secretary (the APCO) will be charged with the logistics
 - Applications will be submitted to all cities eligible for appointment in the rotation
 - Standard application form
 - Applicants will have 30 days to apply
 - Completed applications will be forwarded to all cities within the city's home county for a vote
 - Tally the votes and forward nominations to the Valley-wide Special City Selection Committee





Proposed Schedule

- February 16, 2009 District Mails Apps.
- March 16, 2009 Application Deadline
- April 1, 2009 Ballots mailed to cities within counties with an open seat
- April 15, 2009 Deadline to submit city votes to District
- April 30, 2009 Special City Selection
 Committee makes appointments
