The District's 2016-2017 annual Report to the Community is now available.

The report is a comprehensive review of the Valley's implementation of strategies to protect public health and meet difficult air quality standards, achievement of record-setting improvements and a look behind the scenes at every aspect of the District's day-to-day operations.

"While we continue to face daunting challenges in meeting the latest federal air quality standards and related mandates, the tremendous progress that we have made to date gives us hope and confidence that we can do it again," said Seyed Sadredin, executive director and air pollution control officer, in the opening message of the of the report.

Three city representatives selected for District Governing Board

City council members and mayors from 40 Valley cities met on April 6, 2017, as representatives of the Special City Selection Committee. The committee's function is to fill vacant city representative seats on the Valley Air District's Governing Board.

The District's board totals 15 members: eight county supervisors (one from each of the Valley's eight counties) five city council members or mayors selected by the cities within the District, and two public members appointed by the Governor. These locally elected officials and appointees, acting as policy makers, ensure that implementation of state and federal air pollution mandates in the Valley is tailored to local conditions and is responsive to local needs.

At the April 6th meeting, the Special City Selection Committee elected three new Governing Board members (*pictured at right*).
